CALL TO ORDER

Mr. MacLennan called the meeting to order at 8:42 a.m. and stated that the Board will continue reviewing applications until the hearings begin at 9:00 a.m.

REVIEW OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Mr. Poore, seconded by Mr. Beebe, to approve the minutes from the June 6, 2012 meeting as presented. The motion was unanimously carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Proposal to Deny Hearing – David Schultz

Mr. Stevenson called the hearing to order at 9:08 a.m. and stated that today’s hearing was a result of the Board’s proposal to deny the Journeyman Electrician application of David Schultz per Title 24, 1408 (a)(8). The Board members were introduced. Mr. Stevenson marked as Board Exhibit #1 a packet of documents for licensure including Mr. Schultz’s application and supporting documents, proposal to deny notice, request for hearing and notice of today’s hearing. The Board members were introduced.

Mr. Schultz was sworn in and agreed to proceed without legal counsel. He testified that he has been doing electrical work all of his life and briefly described the history of his electrical experience including with his current employer, Tudor Electric. Mr. Schultz answered questions from the Board.

Mr. Stevenson marked as Respondent’s Exhibits #1 and #2 a letter of recommendation from Tudor Electric and correspondence regarding the reduction of sentence.

Eric Johnson, witness for Mr. Schultz, was sworn in and testified that he worked with Mr. Schultz at Tudor Electric and could attest to his competency of electrical work and professionalism. The Board had no questions for Mr. Johnson.

The hearing went off record and into deliberations at 9:20 a.m. At 9:21 a.m. the hearing went back on record and a motion was made by Mr. King, seconded by Mr. Beebe, to grant a waiver and approve the Journeyman Electrician application of David Schultz. The motion was unanimously carried. The hearing went off record and adjourned at 9:22 a.m. Verbatim testimony was taken by a court reporter.

Proposal to Deny Hearing – Joseph Greenley

Mr. Stevenson called the hearing to order at 9:23 a.m. and stated that today’s hearing was a result of the Board’s proposal to deny the Journeyman Electrician application of Joseph Greenley per Title 24, 1408 (a)(8). The Board members were introduced. Mr. Stevenson marked

as Board Exhibit #1 a packet of documents for licensure including Mr. Greenley's application and supporting documents, proposal to deny notice, request for hearing and notice of today's hearing. The Board members were introduced.

Mr. Greenley was sworn in and agreed to proceed without legal counsel. He testified that he has been doing electrical work since he was 19 years old and he is now 33 years old. He stated that he got into trouble when he was younger, but hasn't gotten into trouble since then and he is now married with step-children. Mr. Greenley briefly described the history of his electrical experience.

Mr. Stevenson asked Mr. Greenley to explain the felony of 3rd degree burglary. Mr. Greenley stated that at the time he had an addiction which had complete control of his life. He added that he has been sober since 1998.

Donald Betts, witness #1 for Mr. Greenley, was sworn in and testified that that he has known Mr. Greenley since 1998 and went into detail on the progression of their professional relationship. There were no questions for this witness from the Board.

Eric Johnson, witness #2, was sworn in and attested to the competency of Mr. Greenley's electrical work. There were no questions for this witness by the Board.

The hearing went off record and into deliberations at 9:38 a.m. The hearing went back on record at 9:39 a.m. and a motion was made by Mr. King, seconded by Mr. Beebe, to grant a waiver and approve the Journeyman Electrician application of Joseph Greenley. The motion was unanimously carried. The hearing went off record and adjourned at 9:39 a.m. Verbatim testimony was taken by a court reporter.

Proposal to Deny Hearing – Sean Flannagan

Mr. Stevenson called the hearing to order at 9:40 a.m. and stated that today's hearing was a result of the Board's proposal to deny the Journeyman Electrician application of Sean Flannagan per Title 24, 1408 (a)(8). The Board members were introduced. Mr. Stevenson marked as Board Exhibit #1 a packet of documents for licensure including Mr. Flannagan's application and supporting documents, proposal to deny notice, request for hearing and notice of today's hearing. The Board members were introduced.

Mr. Flannagan was sworn in and agreed to proceed without legal counsel. He testified that in 1992 he was involved in a car accident, in which he was driving, with three other people in the vehicle. He was charged with reckless driving. He was sentenced to probation and wore an ankle bracelet for 6 months. He began his experience in electrical work in 1991 and started with Local 313 in 1999. The board had no questions for Mr. Flannagan.

The hearing went off record and into deliberations at 9:45 a.m. The hearing went back on record and a motion was made by Mr. King, seconded by Mr. Schreppler, to grant a waiver and approve the Journeyman Electrician application of Sean Flannagan. The motion was unanimously carried. The hearing went off record and adjourned at 9:46 a.m. Verbatim testimony was taken by a court reporter.

Proposal to Deny Hearing – Edmin Miranda

Mr. Stevenson called the hearing to order at 9:51 a.m. and stated that today's hearing was a result of the Board's proposal to deny the Apprentice Electrician application of Edmin Miranda per Title 24, 1408 (a)(8). The Board members were introduced. Mr. Stevenson marked as Board Exhibit #1 a packet of documents for licensure including Mr. Miranda's application and

supporting documents, proposal to deny notice, request for hearing and notice of today's hearing. The Board members were introduced.

Mr. Miranda was sworn in and agreed to proceed without legal counsel. Mr. Miranda testified that his conviction was in 1999 and he went through a boot camp program and has had no other charges since. He added that he is an exceptional employee, has a family now and is currently enrolled in an apprentice program through ABC in Pennsylvania. The Board had no questions for Mr. Miranda.

Mr. Stevenson asked for an explanation of the reckless endangerment conviction. Mr. Miranda stated that at that time he was 21 years old, did not have parents and ran with a bad crowd. He made a bad decision. Mr. Miranda added that he is involved with the community and volunteers with his kid's sports.

The hearing went off record and into deliberations at 9:58 a.m. The hearing went back on record and a motion was made by Mr. King, seconded by Mr. Creedon, to grant a waiver and approve the Apprentice Electrician application of Edmin Miranda. The motion was unanimously carried. The hearing went off record and adjourned at 10:01 a.m. Verbatim testimony was taken by a court reporter.

A motion was made by Mr. MacLennan, seconded by Mr. Creedon, to approve Raymond Stachnick for the Journeyman Electrician license. The motion was unanimously carried.

Signing of Decision and Orders

The Board signed the Decision and Orders from the Proposal to Deny Hearing of Dante Bockhorn. Mr. Stevenson stated that he will have the order from the hearing of Michael Nicholaides at the September meeting.

Discussion of Rules and Regulations

Mr. Stevenson stated that the new law took affect on June 30, 2012. The Rules and Regulations were held up at the June 6, 2012 meeting and today's discussion was not a hearing just a discussion of the proposed amendments to the Rules and Regulations.

Mr. MacLennan stated that the Board will walk through the rules individually to ensure that the housekeeping issues that were brought up in June were clarified.

After review of each rule, a motion was made by Mr. Creedon, seconded by Mr. Beebe, to accept the changes and hold a Rules and Regulations Public Hearing on September 5, 2012. The motion was unanimously carried.
