CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Tyranski called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. The Board introduced themselves to the public.

DISPOSITION OF MINUTES

Meeting Minutes – February 8, 2017

The Board reviewed the minutes of the February 8, 2017 meeting. Mr. Sanders moved, seconded by Ms. Darling, to approve the minutes with changes to clarify the disciplinary action taken against Claudia Cannon, APRN, RN. The motion carried with Dr. Devereaux and Ms. Lambertson abstaining.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Ms. Udealer moved, seconded by Dr. Devereaux, to accept the agenda as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Mack reported the number and types of active licenses as of March 7, 2017.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Review and Consider Final Order from Hearing Officer Recommendation for Deborah Smith, RN

The Board reviewed the final Order from the Hearing Officer recommendations for Deborah Smith. Ms. Smith submitted continuing education documentation to the Board office prior to the Board considering the Hearing Officer recommendations, but the documentation was routed to another unit within the Division. The documentation was not considered at the time the Board considered and accepted the recommendations of the Hearing Officer. Ms. Singh drafted an Order for the Board to consider based on the documentation Ms. Smith submitted. Ms. Salati moved, seconded by Ms. Bastholm to accept the Final Order for Deborah Smith, RN. Ms. Smith shall be issued a letter of reprimand, the 30 continuing education contact hours that she earned after the renewal period will be applied retroactively to the 2013-2015 renewal period and shall not be applied to the current biennial period, and she will be audited at the time of the next renewal in 2017. Motion unanimously carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

APRN Committee

Dr. Williams reported that the Committee met on February 20, 2017. The Committee finalized the draft application for independent practice, which is now available on the Board's website. Dr. Williams advised the Board that the Committee discussed potential statutory changes, which included clarifying language as to when independent practice would take effect. The Committee discussed the independent practice application process, agreed applications will go before the Committee for review, and if deemed acceptable, the Committee will recommend approval to the Board for ratification. The Committee is scheduled to meet on March 20, 2017.

Practice and Education Committee

Ms. Bastholm advised the Board that the Committee did not meet in February. The Committee is in the process of scheduling a meeting in March to continue to work on updating applications for new schools in order to align with the rules and regulations.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Ms. Tyranski informed the Board that she received a motion for an emergency temporary suspension for Kelly Decyk. The Secretary of State rejected the motion for an emergency temporary suspension.

The University of Delaware invited Ms. Tyranski to give a presentation to the senior nursing students to provide an overview of the Board, and to reinforce the rules and regulations for individuals to adhere to the nurse practice act for the jurisdiction(s) in which they plan to practice. The presentation was scheduled for March 7, 2017. Unfortunately, Ms. Tyranski was unable to attend; therefore, Dr. Mack gave the presentation on Ms. Tyranski's behalf.

Ms. Tyranski reported that she was unable to participate in the last President's conference call. She will be attending NCSBN's Midyear meeting with Dr. Mack in Salt Lake City, Utah. She will be attending the President's Round Table meeting, where discussions will revolve around eNLC initiatives.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Dr. Mack circulated materials regarding the upcoming Midyear meeting for Board members to review. She advised the Board that she and Ms. Tyranski will be attending the Compact Administrators meeting on March 12, 2017. On Monday, March 13, 2017, Dr. Mack and Ms. Tyranski will be attending meetings that discuss various legislative issues such as the enhanced nurse licensure compact, opiates, treatment, relapse, and return to work. A separate meeting will occur for jurisdictions that are included in Area 4, such as Delaware, to discuss prominent issues.

Dr. Mack reported that she participated in NCSBN's Executive Officers networking call on February 27, 2017. NCSBN is looking for ideas on how to promote information regarding substance use disorder and the current opioid crisis.

Bonnie Perratto, CNE, and Maryann Foard, MS, RN, Director for Patient Advocacy at Bayhealth, met with Dr. Mack to discuss developing a job description for nurses, whom wish to do volunteer work. It must demonstrate nursing processes, as opposed to nursing aid work. Dr. Mack suggested that they consider educating their nurses of substance use disorder and develop some strategies that may make their nurses aware of the DPHMP for self-referral. Dr. Mack also requested assistance from Ms. Perratto and Ms. Ford to inform their nurses about e-notify for their nurses. The information gathered will help provide accurate work force data.

Dr. Mack observed that Ms. Lane has volunteer to assist with marketing e-notify to nurses. Ms. Lane will work with Board members to have them go to smaller facilities in their respected counties to educate nurses about e-notify and its advantages. Ms. Tyranski advised the Board that she registered with e-notify several months ago and found the process to be simple. She reported that she received a text and e-mail reminding her up her upcoming licensure renewals. Ms. Tyranski also stated that if employers sign up for the institutional e-notify that they can be notified when one of their nurses have been subjected to disciplinary action.

Consideration of Consent Agreements

The Board considered the Consent Agreement for Monica Mills, NP. Ms. Lane moved, seconded by Ms. Lewis to reject the Consent Agreement, as the Board felt that the disciplinary action was not warranted. Motion carried with Mr. Sanders abstaining.

Lynn Needles, RN (Case 11-50-16)

The Board considered the Consent Agreement for Lynn Needles, RN. Mr. Salati moved, seconded by Ms. Udealer to reject the Consent Agreement, as the Board felt it was too lenient considering the aggregating factors. It was suggested that a two-year period of probation be included in the Consent Agreement. Motion unanimously carried.

Joanne Bogardus, RN (Case 11-95-16)

The Board considered the Consent Agreement for Joanne Bogardus, RN. Dr. Williams moved, seconded by Dr. Devereaux, to accept the Consent Agreement. Motion unanimously carried.

Nicole Jackson-Brown, LPN (Case 11-37-16)

The Board considered the Consent Agreement for Nicole Jackson-Brown, LPN. Ms. Darling moved, seconded by Ms. Nellius, to reject the Consent Agreement, as the Board felt it was too lenient considering the aggregating factors. It was suggested that a letter of reprimand and six continuing education credits be included in the Consent Agreement. Motion unanimously carried.

Review and Consideration of Hearing Officer Recommendations

Marian Koroma, RN (Case 11-74-15)

The Board considered the Hearing Officer recommendations for Marian Koroma, RN. Ms. Darling moved, seconded by Dr. Castaldo, to accept the conclusions of law, and findings of fact. The recommended discipline was modified to reflect the following: Ms. Koroma shall be issued a letter of reprimand. Within 60 days of the Board's final Order, she shall provide proof of completion of six continuing contact hours, three in the subject of standard of medical care documentation, and three in the subject of effective use of electronic medical recordkeeping. Motion unanimously carried.

Jamie Matthews, LPN (Rule to Show Cause)

The Board considered the Hearing Officer recommendations for Jamie Matthews, LPN. Mr. Salati moved, seconded by Dr. Williams, to accept the conclusions of law, findings of fact, and recommended discipline. Ms. Matthew's license will be suspended until the Board office received documentary evidence that she has completed 3.65 continuing education contact hours, and a completed verification of Nursing Employment form. Motion unanimously carried.

Victor Mubang, LPN (Rule to Show Cause)

The Board considered the Hearing Officer recommendations for Victor Mubang, LPN. The Board reviewed the completed verification of Nursing Employment form that was submitted by Mr. Mubang's employer on his behalf. Dr. Williams moved, seconded by Mr. Brown to accept the conclusions of law and findings of fact. The recommended discipline was modified to reflect the following: Mr. Mubang shall be issued a letter of reprimand. Within 30 days of the Order, Mr. Mubang must complete three acceptable continuing education contact hours in the subject of substance abuse and submit documentary evidence that he has done so to the Board office. If Mr. Mubang fails to provide proof of the three substance abuse CEs within 30 days of the Order, his license shall be suspended without further notice or a hearing. Additionally, Mr. Mubang will be audited at the time of renewal in 2018. Motion unanimously carried.

Gail Ramsey, LPN (Rule to Show Cause)

The Board considered the Hearing Officer recommendations for Gail Ramsey, LPN. Mr. Salati moved, seconded by Mr. Brown, to accept the conclusions of law, findings of fact, and recommended discipline. Motion unanimously carried.

Gerry Royal, LPN (Rule to Show Cause)

The Board considered the Hearing Officer recommendations for Gerry Royal, LPN. Dr. Castaldo moved, seconded by Dr. Williams, to accept the conclusions of law, findings of fact, and recommended discipline. Motion carried with Mr. Salati abstaining.

Margaret Shebest, LPN (Rule to Show Cause)

The Board considered the Hearing Officer recommendations for Margaret Shebest, LPN. Mr. Sanders moved, seconded by Ms. Lane, to accept the conclusions of law and findings of fact. The recommended discipline was modified to reflect the following: Ms. Shebest shall be issued a letter of reprimand. The 32 continuing education contact hours that she earned after the renewal period will be applied retroactively to the 2014-2016 renewal period and shall not be applied to the current biennial period and Ms. Shebest will be audited at the time of the next renewal in 2018. Motion unanimously carried.

Dr. Mack advised the Board that Ms. Apenteng satisfactorily complied with the November 6, 2014 Order. She advised the Board that the status of Ms. Apenteng's license was changed from probation to active.

Joanne Bogardus, RN (Emergency Temporary Suspension)

Dr. Mack advised the Board that on February 23, 2017, Ms. Tyranski and Secretary of State, Jeffrey Bullock, signed an Order granting an emergency temporary suspension of Ms. Bogardus's license.

Stacy Favarulo, RN (Compliant)

Dr. Mack advised the Board that Ms. Favarulo satisfactorily complied with the February 10, 2016 Order. She advised the Board that the status of Ms. Favarulo's license was changed from probation to active.

Lauren Hynson, RN (Emergency Temporary Suspension)

Dr. Mack advised the Board that on February 10, 2017, Ms. Tyranski and Secretary of State, Jeffrey Bullock, signed an Order granting an emergency temporary suspension of Ms. Hynson's license.

Dr. Mack reported CEU Institute submitted their CE provider renewal application. Dr. Mack has reviewed the documentation and recommends that their CE provider status be renewed. Ms. Nellius moved, seconded by Ms. Bastholm, to renew the CEU Institute as a CE provider. Motion unanimously carried.

2016 Satisfactory Annual CE Reports

Dr. Mack advised the Board that she received satisfactory 2016 Annual CE reports for Governor Bacon Health Center and Brandywine Pediatrics.

Licensure Issues

Review Request for Change in Supervised Practice Plan

Dr. Mack advised the Board that Naikeya Morrison, FNP was previously approved to have a supervised practice plan ("SPP") with the Department of Corrections. Dr. Mack advised the Board that Ms. Morrison is no longer with the Department of Corrections and she has requested approval for a new SPP, with Work Pro Occupational Health. If approved, Ms. Morrison will be issued a temporary permit, without prescriptive authority, for the duration of her SPP, with another practitioner, Ms. Elizabeth Asiyo, FNP, NP-C to supervise.

Ms. Udealer moved, seconded by Ms. Lewis to approve the SPP and to grant a temporary permit for Ms. Morrison to obtain the necessary practice hours. Motion unanimously carried.

The Board observed a brief recess from 10:58 a.m. until 11:02 a.m.

Licensure Issues

Review Motion for Reconsideration

Ms. Singh advised the Board that on January 25, 2017 the Board issued an Order disciplining Ms. Morris's license for failing to comply with the continuing education requirements. Following the Board's decision, Ms. Morris discovered that she completed academic courses during the renewal period for which she did not realize she could receive credit. Ms. Morris submitted her transcript and petitioned the Board to reconsider its decision in light of the fact that she completed over 30 CEs during the renewal period.

The Board considered the motion for reconsideration submitted by Nate Morris, RN. After reviewing the academic transcript, it was determined that Ms. Morris was still deficient the three requisite substance abuse CEs. Ms. Nellius moved, seconded by Ms. Bastholm, to amend the January 25, 2017 Order to provide Ms. Morris credit for the nursing courses she took at Wilmington University in the Spring and Fall Semesters of 2015. Ms. Morris shall be issued a letter of reprimand for failing to complete the three required substance abuse continuing education contact hours within the renewal period. The three substance abuse CE hours earned by Ms. Morris shall be applied retroactively to the 2013-2015 renewal period such that none of the three CEs shall be applied to the current biennial period. Ms. Morris's license will be audited at the time of the next renewal in 2017. Motion unanimously carried.
