

**REGULAR MEETING  
OF  
THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION**

1. A Regular Meeting was called to order by Chairman Dallas Winslow in the Hearing Room, Public Service Commission, 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, Dover, Delaware, on Tuesday, June 4, 2019, at 1:00 p.m. with the following Commissioners in attendance: Joann Conaway, Harold Gray, Manubhai “Mike” C. Karia, and Kim Drexler.

The following Staff members were in attendance: Dr. Raj Barua, Matthew Hartigan, Constance McDowell, Donna Nickerson, Samantha Hemphill, Thomas Walsh, Esq., Deputy Attorney General, and Robert Willard, Esq., Deputy Attorney General.

Commissioner Gray moved to approve the Public and Executive meeting minutes as submitted from the May 7, 2019 meeting; the motion was seconded by Commissioner Conaway and approved 5-0.

Commissioner Conaway moved to approve the meeting minutes as presented from the May 21, 2019 meeting; the motion was seconded by Commissioner Drexler and approved 4-0. Commissioner Gray abstained.

Before the start of the meeting Chairman Winslow congratulated Commissioner Gray for his re-appointment for the next five years and also thanked him for participating in the Grid School conference May 19<sup>th</sup> through May 24, 2019 in Albuquerque, New Mexico regarding how to establish rates on gas.
