Topic 2: Updates from the BHC

Presenter - Laura Rapp of the Behavioral Health Consortium

- Recovery Friendly Workplace: equips employers with tools to hire people in recovery and address the employment needs of community members in recovery.
- BHC Committee Goals for 2024:
 - Employ a data-driven approach to improve outcomes on CLE areas:
 - CIT, PDP, and other resources
 - Access to BH services while incarcerated and connection to services during transition out of and post incarceration.
- Relevant notes for CPS Committee from listening sessions:
 - De-escalation techniques are necessary and critical.
 - Housing and transportation have been identified as barriers.
 - Incarcerated individuals may face stigma.
 - Incarcerated individuals would benefit from employment technology.

Topic 3: Data Driven Approach to Improve Outcome

Presenter- Dr. Debra Mason, Chair of the Corrections and Law Enforcement Committee

- Programs heavily funded by the state of Delaware, unsure if programs are working.
- Try to get a better handle on the continuum of care after release to the community.
- Obtain more statistics to acknowledge if the programs are providing adequate outcomes.
- Made access to treatment based on risk/ LSR score. Denies treatment to a lot of individuals being reentered into the community.
- No accountability because programs don't have to provide statistics to show that the programs are working.
- Multiple tiers complicate the process and leads to a lack of accountability for the programs.
- Asking for programs to show that their programs work rather than complain about them not working.
