Committee Updates

- The Recovery Friendly Workplace Initiative is nested within the Changing Perceptions and Stigma Committee.
- The Education and Prevention Committee is participating in Fentanyl Awareness Day on May 7th.
- The next BHC quarterly meeting is April 16th at 10:00am, there will be a large focus on mental health.
- Relevant notes from listening sessions
 - Direct street outreach
 - Safe housing
 - More community based safe spaces for youth and adults.
- Participants in the listening sessions emphasized the importance of supporting whole person health.
 - Healthy aging
 - Dementia and Alzheimer's education
 - Changing misconceptions about Autism
 - Physical Health, including healthy eating.
- Upcoming listening session is on April 17th from 7:00pm to 8:00pm

Topic 4: Goal 2: Enhance Access to Housing and Promote Housing Stability

Presenter – Patricia Hill, Project Manager of The Springboard Collaborative.

• Springboard Overview

- \circ Founded in Fall of 2020
- Funding and staff hired in June 2022
- Conducted outreach to encampments for seven months prior to opening.
- Forty individuals entered the Village in the first week of opening in January 2023.
- Fifteen staff were hired in the first week.
- o 109 participants served during since opening the Village.
- Zero participants have died due to overdose.
- One person died due to natural causes.
- Three overdose reversals have occurred, the latest was in July of 2023.

• Participant Data

- o 38 individuals are currently residing in the Village.
- 26 have medical providers.
- o 12 currently are in Mental Health of Substance use treatment.
- o 29 organizations collaborate with Springboard to provide services for Village participants.
- 19 of those are in the health care field.
- o 12 are Substance Use or Mental Health Providers
- 8 are Physical health care providers.
- 20 obtained housing
- \circ 17 have retained housing for three months.
- 32 have benefits income.
- 25 have job income.
- Summary
 - Total Population: 109
 - Substance Use: 72 or 66%
 - Mental Health: 28 or 26%
 - Dual Diagnosis: 16 or 15%
 - Total unique individuals with SUD/MH: 84 or 77%
 - Total unique individuals with SUD receiving treatment: 27 or 38%
